**JERSEY CITY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY
BROWN PLACE SEWER REPLACEMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS

Sealed bids for the **BROWN PLACE SEWER REPLACEMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS** will be received by the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority in the Anthony J. Fiola Memorial Conference Room, Administration Building, located at 555 Route 440, Jersey City, New Jersey on **February 20, 2014 at 1:00 PM** prevailing time, at which time they will be publicly opened and read aloud. This is a re-bid and a pre-bid conference will not be conducted.

Briefly described, work under this contract includes but is not limited to the construction of 559 LF of 38 inch x 60 inch Class IV Vertical Elliptical Reinforced Concrete Pipe (VERCP)(ASTM C507), 703 LF of 34 inch x 53 inch VERCP (ASTM C507), 875 LF of 32 inch x 49 inch VERCP (ASTM C507), 78 LF of 29 inch x 45 inch VERCP (ASTM C507), 31 LF of 24 inch x 38 inch VERCP (ASTM C507), 46 feet of 60 inch RCP CL IV Pipe (ASTM C361), 460 feet of 36 inch RCP CL IV Pipe (ASTM C361), 102 feet of 18 inch PVC PS 115 Pipe (ASTM F794), 338 LF of 15 inch RCP CL IV Pipe (ASTM C76), 157 LF of 12 inch PVC SDR 26 (ASTM D3034), 1,200 feet of 6 inch SDR 35 PVC Pipe (ASTM D3034), 40 feet of 4 inch SDR 35 PVC Pipe (ASTM D3034), 200 CY of test pits, 1 4-foot concrete Manhole, 13 5-foot concrete Manholes, 4 6-foot concrete manholes, 2 4-foot by 6-foot drop manholes, 1 7-foot concrete junction chamber, 1 8-foot concrete junction chamber, 2 6-foot concrete junction chamber, 18 drainage inlets Type B, 1 drainage inlet Type B head and grate casting only, 12,000 SY milling, 12,000 SY HMA 12.5 H64 surface course 2" Thick, 3,467 SY HMA base course mix 19H64 8" Thick, 3,500 CY of dense graded aggregated base course stone, 100 gallons of tack coat, 175 gallons of prime coat, 15,322 CY Excavation Unclassified, 3,605 CY Stone Bedding, 8,863 CY Select Fill, 211 CY Controlled Fill, 250 SF traffic markings, 2,275 LF of 4 inch striping, thermoplastic, 1,080 LF of 6 inch striping, thermoplastic, 96 LF of 24" striping, thermoplastic, 200 SY of 5" concrete sidewalk, 25 SY of 6" concrete drive aprons, 100 LF of concrete curb, 250 CY of rock excavation, 100 Tons of Disposal of Contaminated Material and all required environmental restoration, utility relocation, and disposal required. Work under this contract involves all labor and equipment for sewer improvements in the Brown Place, Princeton Avenue and Linden Avenue area.

The Contractor is responsible to comply with all laws, regulations, OSHA regulations and other applicable requirements. The successful bidder shall be responsible for securing all municipal and county permits as may be required for performance of the work.

All bids shall be presented to the OWNER by the parties bidding, or their agents, at the place and time designated, when called for by the OWNER. No bids will be received prior to the time designated and none will be accepted thereafter. All Bids must be submitted in person by a representative of the entity submitting the bid and the bidder must be present throughout the entire bid opening. Contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder as found in the N.J.S.A. 40A: 11-6.1.

Contract Documents may be examined at the offices of the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority, 555 Route 440, Jersey City, New Jersey or at the offices of Mayo, Lynch and Associates, Inc., One Marine Plaza, North Bergen, New Jersey 07047. Copies may be picked up at the offices of Authority upon a non-refundable payment of \$100.00 for each set (Check or Money Orders ONLY). Neither the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority nor the ENGINEER will be responsible for full or partial sets of Contract Documents, including any addenda obtained from other sources.

Checks or money orders for Contract Documents shall be made payable to the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority. Any Bidder who purchased specifications for the prior bid shall be given a set of specifications free of charge.

Each bid must be accompanied by a Certificate of Consent of Surety written by a Surety company listed on the Federal Treasury List (Environmental Protection Department Circular 570-Surety Companies Acceptable on Federal Bonds) as required by N.J.A.C. 7:22-3.17 and either a bid bond or Certified check for not less than ten (10%) percent of the amount of the bid or \$20,000.00 maximum whichever is the lesser. Certified checks shall be made payable to Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority. The said Surety shall be bound to furnish Performance and Labor and Material and Maintenance Bonds, each in an amount equal to one hundred percent of the Contract Price.

BIDDER MUST SUPPLY ONE (1) ORIGINAL AND ONE (1) COPIES OF THE BID. IN ADDITION, BIDDER MUST SUPPLY ONE CD ROM VERSION IN PDF FORMAT.

BIDDERS ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF N.J.A.S. 10:5-31 et. seq. AND N.J.A.C. 17:27 Affirmative Action State of New Jersey.

Accompanying the bid of corporation or a partnership, there shall be submitted a statement setting forth the name and address of all stockholders in the corporation or partnership who own 10% or more of its stock, of any class; or of all individual partners in the partnership who own a 10% or greater interest therein, as the case may be. If one or more such stockholder(s) or partner(s) is itself a corporation or partnership the stockholders holding 10% or more of that corporation's stock, or the individual partners owning a 10% or greater interest in that partnership, as the case may be, shall also be listed. The disclosure shall be continued until names and addresses of every non-corporate stockholder and individual partner exceeding the 10% ownership criteria established in the applicable New Jersey Public Laws of 1977, Chapter 8, has been listed. The requirements of P.L. 1977 Chapter 8 N.J.S.A. 52:25-24.2 are applicable to all forms of corporations and partnerships including limited partnerships, limited liability corporations, limited liability partnerships and subchapter S corporations.

The attention of the BIDDERS is called particularly to the requirements of the N.J. Prevailing Wage Act N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.25 et seq. with respect to conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid as required by the Contract Documents. In accordance with The Public Works Contractor Registration Act C.P.L. 1999, c.238, as amended by P.C. 2003, Brown Place Sewer Replacement and Improvements

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c.91) No Contractor shall bid on any contract for Public Work as defined in Section 2 of P.L. 1963, c.150 (c.3411-56.26) unless the contractor is registered pursuant to the act.

This Contract or subcontract is expected to be funded in part with funds from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust. Neither the State of New Jersey, the New Jersey Infrastructure Trust, nor any of their departments, agencies or employees is, or will be, a party to this contract or subcontract or any lower tier contract or subcontract. This contract or subcontract is subject to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 7:22-3,4,5,9, and 10. The successful bidder must comply with all the provisions of N.J.A.C. 7:22-9.1 et. Seq. for the participation of small business enterprises owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals (SEDs) and the requirements of the JCMUA Socially and Economically Disadvantaged (SED) Utilization Plan dated April 2012.

No BIDDER may withdraw his Bid within sixty days after the date of the opening of Bids without the written consent of the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority.

All questions regarding the bidding documents, plans and specifications shall be submitted prior to the bid date with sufficient time to allow for issuance of responses.
